Hindi is not only the country's most-spoken language, but it is the third most-spoken language in the world with 615 million speakers after English, Mandarin, according to the UN. Apart from India, the language is spoken in different countries including Nepal, Bangladesh, Fiji, Mauritius, Suriname, Guyana, Trinidad and Tobago among others. World Hindi Day is observed to commemorate first anniversary of World Hindi Conference that took place in 1975 in Nagpur, Maharashtra. The word Hindi got its name from the Persian word Hind which means the 'land of Indus River'. The language is derived from Sanskrit and is written in Devnagari script.
